

Publication Ethics and Malpractice Statement

The *OUSL Journal* adheres to the <u>Code of Conduct and Best Practice</u> <u>Guidelines for Journal Editors</u> published by the Committee on Publication Ethics.

Authors are required in compliance with all the following items related to publication ethics as part of the submission process, and manuscripts that do not adhere to guidelines may be returned to authors.

- The submission should be original and has not been previously published, nor has it been submitted to another journal for consideration.
- The text adheres to the ethic, stylistic and bibliographic requirements specified in the Author Guidelines.
- In submitting manuscript to the journal, the instructions in ensuring a blind review should be followed.
- In case of plagiarism or if a paper is found not to be original, it will be rejected or removed, as the case may be.
